Did you know?

DEQ and the EPA require public water systems to monitor, test and report water quality on a routine basis. Two of the most common tests for identifying the presence of disease causing organisms are for Total Coliforms (TCR) and E-Coli.

Each month, the City of Cascade collects two water samples from two sources at opposite ends of the water supply system. These sample collection sources are rotated randomly and can include commercial businesses and water storage tanks.

Should any violation in reporting occur or should a presence of one of these waterborne pathogens be present in a tested water sample, the City of Cascade is required to notify the public.

Please, **BE WATER WISE**

Focus on prevention

Insulate exposed pipes w/pipe sleeves or heat tape.

Maintain your water heater.

Clean the gutters and avoid ice.

Keep the heat on.—55 degree minimum

Drip faucets *

* Drip at least one faucet...and make it the furthest away from the water meter to keep water flowing through the pipes.

Keep under sink cabinet doors open so the heat can reach them.
