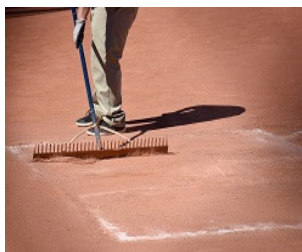

### Monthly Water Testing Results



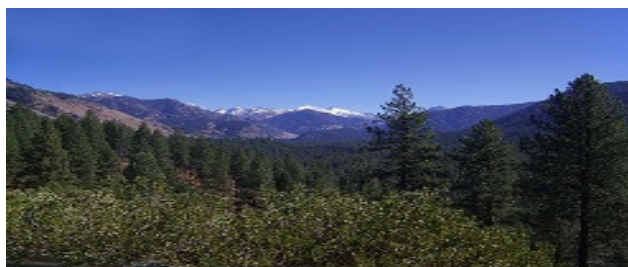

### ROADS - Parking

## Please, **BE WATER WISE**

Approximately 25% of household water use occurs in the bathroom and another 25% in the laundry room.

Turn water off while brushing teeth

Turn water off while soaping up in shower

Keep water container in fridge so water does not run until its cold enough to drink.

EnergyStar dishwashers use 5.5 gallons of water - less water than it takes to wash dishes by hand

Faucet aerators can reduce amount of water flow.

During the last 8 months the Lakeshore lift station has been repeatedly obstructed with large, household cotton mopheads.

This causes lift station failure and could result in waste water backing up into your home. We ask you be mindful of what goes into your sewer and dispose of items like mop heads into a garbage receptacle and not the city sewer.

Debris other than toilet paper can clog pumps and ultimately ends up in the city waste water ponds with adverse effects.

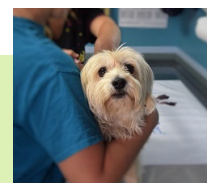

### *Did you know?*

#### **CITY CODE - Dogs**



City code 5-1 requires dogs within city limits to be licensed. New tags for 2020 are available at City Hall.

#### **License requirements, fees and fines**

Dogs over 4 months old must be vaccinated.

Dogs acquired or moved into the city must be vaccinated within 30 days.

No license will be issued to a dog without proof of rabies vaccination.

\$10.00 for dogs spayed or neutered.

\$25.00 for dogs **not** spayed or neutered.

\$25.00 dog at large - first offense.

\$50.00 dog at large - second offense
