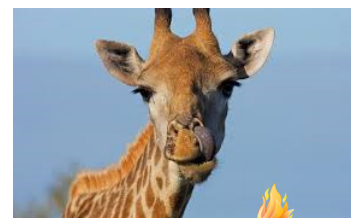

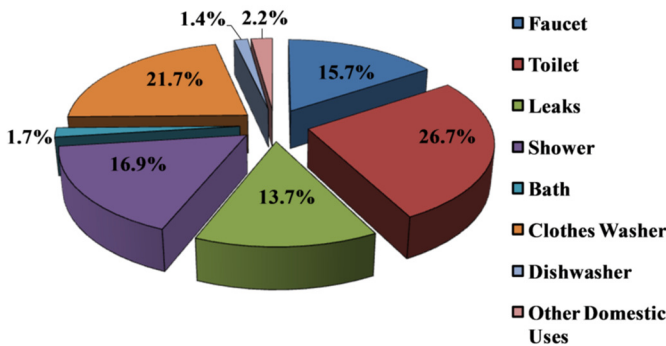

THEIR HEALTH

The native animals that live here, including birds, deer, fox, raccoons and squirrels, need nature's diet to be healthy.

Human food and bagged feed is "junk" food for wildlife. Well-intentioned handouts may cause disease, injury, and even death for the animals.

Providing unnatural food encourages wildlife to congregate in large numbers, leading to territorial fighting, attacks by predators, and being hit by cars.

Animals you feed today may be killed as "pests" tomorrow. Don't harm wildlife with your kindness...help them remain healthy, safe, and free.

YOUR SAFETY

Native animals who eat human food...

May bite, scratch or threaten other visitors.

May come into conflict with your pets.

May spread disease.
