### City Code, Title 8-9-8

#### INJURY TO SEWERAGE SYSTEM UNLAWFUL

(A) It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to maliciously, willfully or negligently break, damage, destroy, uncover, deface or tamper with any structure, appurtenance or equipment which is a part of the sewerage works.

## Please, **BE WATER WISE**

*Here are some tips for conserving water and keeping your monthly bill manageable.*

### INSIDE

**Don't let the faucet run while you clean vegetables**  
Rinse your vegetables instead in a bowl or sink full of water.

**Keep a bottle of drinking water in the refrigerator**  
Stop to the wasteful practice of running tap water to cool it for drinking.

### OUTSIDE

**Water at the right time**  
Water landscapes early in the morning, when air is still and evaporation loss minimal. Conversely, avoid watering on windy days and at midday, when water frequently evaporates before it can soak into soil.

**Reconsider slopes**  
It's difficult to irrigate slopes efficiently. Buffer and reduce runoff on grassy slopes by planting edges with ground covers or shrubs. Native plants are an ideal choice.

**Know your soil**  
Use short, repeated watering cycles to deliver water at a rate soil can absorb. Most irrigation controllers can be programmed to water in short, repeated intervals. Follow this same technique when irrigating slopes. Also consider amending soil with organic matter to improve soil's water holding capacity.

**Build basins**  
Mound soil to form a water collection basin around plants and shrubs. If space permits, extend the basin to a plant's dripline

**Dethatch & aerate**  
Help lawns absorb water efficiently by limiting thatch and aerating on a regular basis.

**Collect rain**  
Create your own water supply by collecting rain runoff. Rain barrels offer fast and easy installation.

### **FREE DUMP DAYS IN CASCADE**

**June 3rd ~ June 6th**

**It's free until it's full.** Then folks will have to haul to the transfer site. People cleaning up their yards and sheds should visit the Valley County Transfer Site online to verify what is acceptable for free dumping. Items for which there is a fee, must be taken to the transfer site. Attendant at the Cascade dumpster, will not be collecting fees or allowing these items to be dumped.

#### **Items which will be acceptable at the Cascade site are:**

Residential trash.  
NO commercial dumping here.  
Household trash.  
Yard trash which does not qualify for the woody debris dumpster.  
Furniture items, but **NO APPLIANCES**.  
Shed and garage rubbish.
