Your November 2020 bill will reflect this rate increase.

Your water bill will increase from \$79.40 to \$80.61. Example based on 3/4-1" pipe. Larger pipe sizes will be adjusted accordingly.

The water use rate includes your first 7,000 gallons and the charge per gallon beyond the 7,000 gallons will continue to be billed at \$0.0075 per gallon or an additional \$7.50 per thousand gallons.

IS YOUR YARD WINTER READY?

For your lawns

There are a few tips you should follow when preparing your lawn for winter. Mow grass to a height of 2-1/2 inches and leave clippings on the lawn. This simple step returns at least 25% of the turf's nitrogen back to the soil. Lawns should be put to bed over winter at the same height they are maintained over summer.

For your garden beds

Great mulches for winter include bark chips, shredded bark, straw, evergreen boughs and other loose, coarsetextured organic materials.

The good news is that the right mulch applied in winter can help maintain a steady soil temperature, thereby protecting plants from temperature extremes. That's because winter mulch acts as an insulating blanket that provides a protective barrier between the soil and the air.

Or just till up the garden beds so that you can send nutrients back into the soil and mix everything together so that once snow or cold weather freezes the ground you'll lock those nutrients in and help the soil get ready to feed your plants come planting season.
