

Please, BE WATER WISE



Water scarcity is both a natural and man-made phenomenon.

There is enough water on the planet for six billion people but it is distributed unevenly and too much of it is wasted, polluted and unsustainably managed.

Water managers typically assess scarcity by looking at the population-water equation. An area is experiencing water scarcity when annual water supplies drop below 1,700 m2 per person.

When annual water supplies drop below 1,000 m2 per person, the population faces water scarcity, and below 500 cubic meters "absolute scarcity"
