FIREWISE LANDSCAPES

Build defensible space around your home.

More fire resistant plants share characteristics. They often:

- * have a higher moisture content in their leaves
- * have little seasonal buildup of dead vegetation
- * have low, compact growth form
- * are high in soap or salt content
- * have green stems * are drought tolerant

Less fire resistant plants typically share one or more of the following characteristics. They often:

- * are water-stressed
- * accumulate fine, twiggy, dry, or dead material
- * are evergreen
- * have stiff, leathery, small, or fine, lacy leaves
- * have loose or papery bark
- * will flame when preheated ignited with a match
- * retain low-growing branches even as they become shaded

Please, **BE WATER WISE**


