

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM) 5-category system that measures the intensity of drought in a region as "D0" abnormally dry to "D4" exceptionally dry; Valley County currently registers as a level three or "D2" intensity. This information is updated weekly on Thursdays.

How do I Firewise my property?
