Business Licenses Are Here!

On Monday, October 25, 2021 the City Council approved Ordinance No. 715 requiring business licenses within the City limits of Cascade.

The purpose of the long awaited Business License is to maintain an accurate listing of the trades, businesses, and professions located in the city in order to:

- (A) Further the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Cascade, so that the City, especially the first responders, have knowledge of the materials and activities present within such businesses in the event of emergencies.
- (B) To streamline the administration of LOT revenue by accurately assessing LOT qualified businesses and identifying those that require tax collection permitting.
- (C) Allow the city and other interested parties to better communicate with the Cascade business community and comprehend the business categories that may be over and under served in the area which may assist in the City obtaining grant funding.

With the January 1, 2022 LOT implementation date approaching, an FAQ document along with a "Getting Started" packet will be mailed and made available in November.

Business license applicants will need to submit completed forms to the City Clerk by December 20, 2021.
