

SPRING IS HERE Learn Before You Burn



NO BURNING is allowed May 10th thru October 20th.

Burn piles of vegetative yard debris should be no more than 3' in circumference.

Be considerate of your neighbors, pay attention to wind direction. Have a hose handy.

DUMPSTER DAYS are approaching!

May 28 thru June 8, 2022. Vegetative yard debris only. No plastic bags.

A single dumpster will be located in the parking lot across from the fire station at Pine and Front St.

WATER STUDY RESULTS

The City recently completed a draft capital facility plan for the drinking water distribution system. The facility plan details the existing condition of the system, identifies current needs, projects future conditions, and provides detailed recommendations for improvements. System performance was evaluated according to service requirements (pressure, flow, etc.) set by the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality. The purpose of the plan is to identify how drinking water can be served at the most economical price while meeting the service requirements. Well capacity, water pressure, and fire flow capacity are some of the criteria that were considered. Just over \$3.3 million of projects were identified, including:

\$1.87 million of pipeline upgrades \$179,800 for service connection upgrades \$139,000 for new fire hydrants to improve coverage \$334,900 for new meters \$810,400 for a new drinking water well

Facility plan findings will be presented at the **April 11, 2022** City council meeting and public participation is invited.
