

# Please, **BE WATER WISE**

#### The Water Around Us

Water plays a big role in supporting our communities. Without water there would be no local business or industry. Fire-fighting, municipal parks, and public swimming pools all need lots of water. An array of pipes, canals, and pumping stations managed by our public water systems are needed to bring a reliable supply of water to our taps each day.

Where does all this water come from? It starts out as rain or snow and flows into our local lakes, rivers, and streams or into underground aquifers.

#### Fresh water is a FINITE resource.

#### **Conserve - In the Bathroom**

Install toilet dam/plastic bottle in tank \* Shower 1 minute less \* Check toilet for silent leaks; place a drop or two of food coloring in tank. If it leaks into the bowl, fix it.

#### Conserve - In the Kitchen or Laundry

Compost food scraps; don't use disposal \* Keep a gallon of water in fridge rather than run tap for cold water \* In washing machine - wash with warm & rinse with cold.

#### **Conserve** - **Outdoors**

Reduce or eliminate grass covered areas \* keep grass at 3" high \* water in early morning or late evening \* Use drip irrigation where feasible \* Use porous pavement for driveways/walkways instead of asphalt so rain and run off can recharge groundwater supplies \* broom off pathways instead of using a hose \* Wash car with sponge and soapy *bucket* of water.
